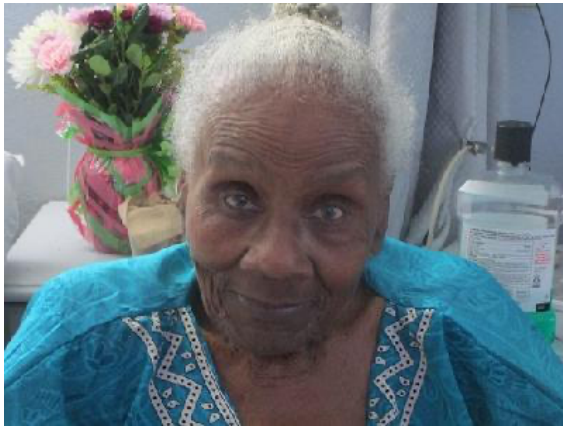




OUTCOMES MATTER



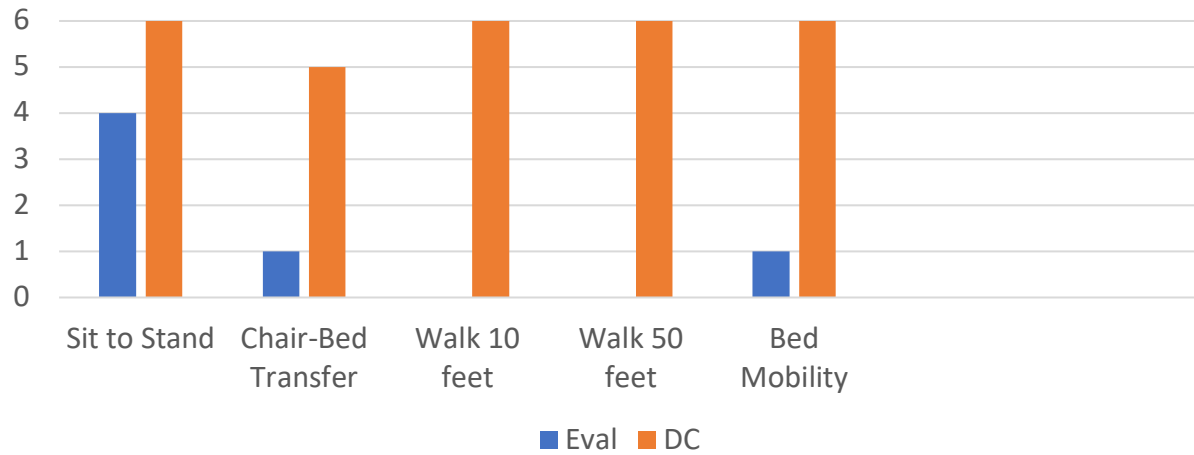
Mrs. Annie Lott is a 97-year-old who initially presented to St. Lukes the vintage with altered mental status following confusion at home. Mrs. Lott was diagnosed with transient ischemic attack. Mrs. Lott was treated for these conditions with positive results and discharged to Park Manor CyFair on May 2nd 2024.

Mrs. Annie Lott was evaluated by Physical, Occupational and Speech therapy services. The initial assessments indicated Mrs. Lott required Max A for UB dressing, Total assistance for LB dressing. She was total for toileting and bathing. She was total transfers and unable to ambulate. Mrs. Lott had increased risk of falls, increased dependence on others for care and increase for skin integrity issues.

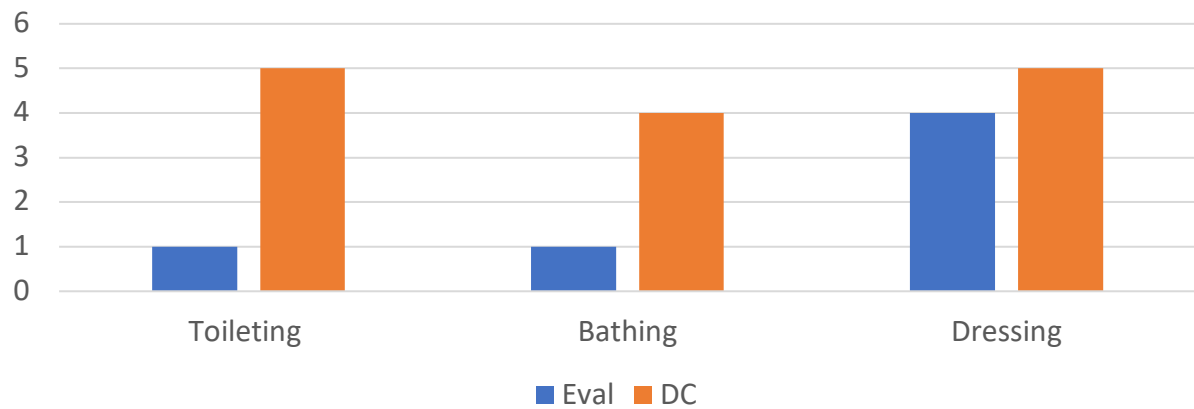
Physical, Occupational, and Speech therapy created plans of care that were individualized for Mrs. Lott and following 41 days of skilled physical rehabilitation she demonstrated significant improvements in her functional mobility and ability to perform her activities of daily living. Mrs. Lott increased her ability to perform UB dressing with set-up, LB dressing to Min A. toileting to Min A, UB bathing with SBA and LB bathing with Min A. She improved her bed mobility to Modified Independent and able to ambulate 60ft with a RW with CGA. She was able also complete 4 stairs with CGA.

Mrs. Lott was successfully discharged home with home health services. Great Job Mrs. Lott!

MDS Section GG Functional Scores

06 - Independent

Completes the activity by him/herself with no assistance from a helper

05- Setup or clean-up assistance

Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity.

04 - Supervision or touching assistance

Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently.

03 - Partial/moderate assistance

Helper does LESS THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs, but provides less than half the effort.

02 - Substantial/maximal assistance

Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort.

01 - Dependent

Helper does ALL of the effort. Patient does none of the effort to complete the activity. Or the assistance of 2 or more helpers is required for the patient to complete the activity.
