

OUTCOMES MATTER




Mrs. Suzanne Lintner is a 79-year-old that had a recent fall at home. She presented to Methodist Willowbrook and was diagnosed with a sacral fracture. Following her hospital stay she was admitted to Park Manor CyFair.

Mrs. Lintner was evaluated by Physical, Occupational and Speech therapy services. The initial assessments indicated that she requires total assistance for bathing toileting, lower body dressing and transfers. She required maximum assistance for upper body dressing and bed mobility. Her problem solving and memory were both severe. Prior to admission, She was Modified independent with ambulation and ADL's. Mrs. Linter stated her goal is to be able to walk with a RW to move out of state with her sister in Colorado.

Physical, Occupational, and Speech therapy created plans of care that were individualized for Mrs. Linter and following 34 days of skilled physical rehabilitation she demonstrated significant improvements in her functional mobility and her ability to perform her activities of daily living.

She improved her problem solving to supervision and her memory to mild. She increased her bathing, toileting and lower body dressing to Minimum assistance. She improved bed mobility and transfers to stand by assistance. She is now able to ambulate with a RW with contact guard assistance for 150.

Mrs. Linter is now on her way to moving to Colorado to enjoy her time with her sister. Congratulation Mrs. Suzanne!

06 - Independent Completes the activity by him/herelf with no assistance from a helper 05- Setup or clean-up assistance $\label{persets} \mbox{Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. \mbox{ Helper assists}$ only prior to or following the activity. 04 - Supervision or touching assistance Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity.
