



Pablo Santiago 89-year-old male history of A-fib, diastolic CHF, CKD, diabetes, hypertension hyperlipidemia, pulmonary fibrosis, sick sinus syndrome, presents to the ED at St. Lukes the Vintage via EMS from home for evaluation of generalized weakness x 1 day reports last night he was too weak to get up from the toilet needing assistance from family, when normally he ambulates with a walker. He was treated for these conditions and discharged to Park Manor CyFair for post-acute skilled nursing and rehab on 6/21/2024.

Mr. Santiago was evaluated by Physical and Occupational therapy services and the initial assessments indicated that Mr. Santiago required Maximum assistance for bathing, toileting dressing, bed mobility and transfers. He was not able to ambulate.

Physical and Occupational therapy services created plans of care that were individualized for Mr. Santiago. He demonstrated significant improvements in his functional mobility and ability to perform activities of daily living. He improved his bathing to Stand By Assistance, Toileting to Supervision, Dressing to Supervision, Bed mobility to Independent, transfers to Set up and able to ambulate with a RW 125ft with Stand By Assistance.

Mr. Santiago was able to return home with home health. Great job Mr. Santiago! We are proud of you





MDS Section GG Functional Scores

06 - Independent

Completes the activity by him/herelf with no assistance from a helper

05- Setup or clean-up assistance

Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity.

04 - Supervision or touching assistance

Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently.

03 - Partial/moderate assistance

 $\label{thm:period} \mbox{Helper does LESS THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs, but provides less than half the effort.}$

02 - Substantial/maximal assistance

Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort.

01 - Dependent

Helper does ALL of the effort. Patient does none of the effort to complete the activity. Or the assistance of 2 or more helpers is required for the patient to complete the activity.
